

The coming General Election will be within the next 18 months and offers the voting public a chance to change the shape of politics, This General Election will be fought on the new boundaries established by the Boundaries Commission.

Our local party will now contest the constituency called Aberdeenshire North and Moray East. This extends from Cruden Bay on the East Coast to Spey Bay on the Moray Coast to the west of Fochabers and Buckie. The constituency covers a wide area of the North East and Moray Coast, and will challenge the party's resources, so we are looking for new members and existing members to help where they can.

Christine said she still has the blue flower Richard gave her when she went to visit him outside the Iranian Embassy when he was on hunger strike during Nazanin's six year imprisonment in Iran.
